You need:

- Felt pens

- Photos or magazines

How to make your book:

You need:

8 Sock Puppet

You need:

- Old socks
- Felt pens
- Craft glue
- Buttons, sequins, wool etc.

How to make it: Draw on the mouth and stick on eyes. Your sock puppet might be a dog or a cat, a dinosaur or a monster, and is only limited by your child's imagination.



9 Coloured Glasses

You need:

- Cardboard lunch wrap or toilet roll cylinders
- Coloured cellophane
- Sticky tape

How to make it: Tape the coloured cellophane to the end of the cardboard cylinders and have fun looking at the world through different coloured "glasses".



10 Rockets

You need:

- Two meters of string
- Two chairs
- Masking tape
- Balloons
- Drinking straw

How to make it: Thread the string through the straw and tie it to the chairs. Move the chairs far enough apart to stretch the string tight. Blow up the balloon but don't tie the end off, hold it tightly closed while you tape the balloon across the top to the straw. Release the balloon and watch your rocket ship goooo!



11 Mobile Phones

You need:

- Two funnels
- Plastic tubing to fit the end of the funnel

How to make it: Push the plastic tube onto the end of each funnel and have fun talking to each other from room to room.



12 Stethoscope

You need:

- Short length (about 90cm) of plastic tubing
- Two small funnels to fit the plastic tubing

How to make it: Push the plastic tube on to each end of the funnel. Place one end over your ear and the other over the heart. Listen to the changes in heart rate as you jump, run and rest.
